

Pastor's corner - January 24 & 31, 2010

In this week of prayer for Christian Unity it is appropriate to remind us of our fundamental agreement as Christians that we believe in a God who is love and of a God who wishes to bring to completion the whole of creation, the whole world, in God's image.

While I was away in Toronto at the First National Catholic Conference on Refugee Sponsorship I learned of the death at the age of 95 of probably the most influential Dominican theologian of our time: Edward Schillebeeckx, O.P., a member of the Dutch Province of Dominican Friars, although he was born in Belgium. I was privileged to have spent some time with him when I was asked to accompany him during the 1967 Theology of Renewal Symposium which brought many People of God together with a large number of theologians (Rahner; Metz, Kung, Baum, Davies, Pannenberg, Tillard, Ducocq, Dulles, etc.) in order to joyfully celebrate the promises and hope engendered by Vatican II.

Schillebeeckx embodied the conviction which we as Dominicans always have had about the fundamental goodness of creation and of the human created in God's image, and therefore about the fundamental goodness of the world, of this world. At a symposium held in his honour in Leuven in 2008, Schillebeeckx expressed his love for the world and his belief that rather than the totally restrictive saying "no salvation outside the Church", we should be saying: "There is no salvation outside the world!"

Anyone who has read his groundbreaking first book, Christ the Sacrament of the Encounter With God, will have noticed that for Schillebeeckx God's Spirit, God's Grace, is everywhere. God's Incarnation which we just celebrated at Christmas should be taken seriously and should remind us that the mystery of God is to be encountered in all of human life and in all of creation. Amid a world of radical suffering God holds open a future full of hope, the promise of the fullness of life, "God's eternal surprise."

Mary Catherine Hilker, O.P., wrote in the editorial comment of America Magazine (Jan. 18): "Throughout his teaching (and preaching) career and in his writing, Schillebeeckx emphasized that we experience God's love, the creative and saving presence of God's grace, wherever human persons minister to one another, especially to the neighbor in need. Human love is an embodiment, a sacrament, of God's love. These human "fragments of salvation," as he called them, are a share in the final triumph of God's grace, which was promised in a definitive way in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus the Christ. Christians are called to participate in the living story of Jesus by "writing a fifth Gospel with their lives." This sacramental view of the world, and of the church's role within the world (Church, the Human Story of God, the final volume of his Christological trilogy), remained at the heart of Father Schillebeeckx's writing, preaching and teaching for over seven decades. It was also central to the vision of the Second Vatican Council, which he helped to shape as an advisor to Cardinal Bernard Alfrink and the Dutch bishops. ... (He always) reminded his readers that "God is new each moment" and that in situations of injustice, whether in the world or in the church (he suffered a great deal from the human inadequacies of the institutional church), the Spirit of God is actively at work, prompting resistance, hope, courage and change."

Schillebeeckx loved the Church and his community, the Order of Preachers (Dominicans). His passing calls on us to love the Church and our community despite their flaws.
